The Presidents Show takes a look at the presidency of The United States and the election process.



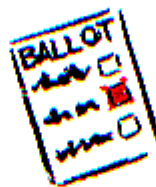
- How do you get to be president?

This is all done with fun audience participation, magic and silly costumes that Don Miller's shows have come to be known by. It's a look at the history of some of America's most famous leaders as people, not icons, but people who succeeded in the face of tough problems.

These stories inspire children. Franklin Delano Roosevelt had polio and wasn't able to walk. He helped lead the world through the 2nd World War. Teddy Roosevelt, who had asthma, was a fragile child. Abraham Lincoln had limited time in school. He taught himself how to be a lawyer.



President Taft, who weighed at his election over 330 pounds, (and got stuck in the White House bathtub) still rose to the nation's top job. Children are dressed up in coats, wigs, hats, etc... and help tell these stories. Many of the props in the show are produced magically, which adds to the excitement.



The Presidents Show has an election with children as candidates, ballot boxes, political parties and even some ballots that magically disappear. A set of fake political banners and slogans helps everyone understand some of the reasons for different political parties.



After explanations of what the president does, the show ends with the question, how many of the boys want to be president? Then, how many girls? Finally, with a summary that reminds us that almost anyone in our republic could be our country's leader someday, the children are dismissed to dream big dreams. Don Miller presents the presidents in a fun and inspirational way.
